### Happy Birthday Jesus is one of our favorite times of the year!

By our recollection, Saturday December 3<sup>rd</sup> marked the 20<sup>th</sup> Happy Birthday Jesus Party, too! So, once again, early that morning volunteers from at least six churches and ministries started showing up at First Baptist Church, our hosting church. By 10 AM, busses were returning with 220 children and 30 moms and dads and by 11 AM, 250 Chick Fil A chicken sandwiches, graciously provided by our host church, had met their demise. From there, we marched over to the main auditorium for a fun and fired-up time led by Pastor Angel and followed by the Kingdom Kidz, led by Teri Van Duyn, and the presentation of The Fear Not Factor.

This year, for the first time, we were excited to partner with Shiloh Metropolitan Baptist Church at Centennial Townhomes West. We ran a pilot program in November and then invited those children and families to which we ministered to our Christmas Party. We had some 50 children and parents from that pilot program attend with us! This was in addition to our other sites from Normandy Estates, Desert Winds, Washington Heights, and Eureka Gardens. Some 75 volunteers came together to help wrap presents, pass out presents, set out food, escort children and families to the auditorium and, finally, counsel those wanting to trust Jesus Christ as their Savior. Thirteen people made professions of faith this year, praise God!





#### Today at Normandy Estates By Jamey Weber, Site Leader

"What a privilege it is and has been to work with the children at Normandy Estates. We are a somewhat unique site in that we are watching year after year many of the children grow, from young children to teenagers, non-readers to readers.

God's purpose for us is to disciple and it is such a joy to see His work with young Children. There are 7 children that have been faithful to the program for at least 4 years or more, and then we have a few drop in and out and then in. We see changes in the children, some have softened attitudes, and a few that we know are growing to know the Lord personally. There is such an advantage to having God's word and influence in the same neighborhood. We are reminded that we may be the only Jesus they see, and now these children – these disciples - may be the only Jesus others see.

God certainly works in us, the SFS missionary volunteers, to be able to build relationships and be encouraged every week to return to our extended family."

You may have heard we are trying to replace our 17-year old primary truck we use on-site. The converted plumber's truck, practically donated by Darley's Plumbing, has been a Godsend and a VERY versatile tool. For those who have not visited a site — and we encourage you to do so — that truck has to hold: flags, footballs, soccer balls, hula hoops, trash can, tarps, sandbag weights, extra battery, inverter, charger, tester, candy, prizes, coloring sheets, crayons, memory verses, attendance records, collection tin for First Coast Women's Services, Bibles, Bible stories, song posters, pledge posters, song recordings, sound board, speakers, mics, wiring, work desk, folding table and chair, etc, etc, etc (imagine an old Bugs Bunny cartoon where that list is being said faster and faster until the individual words are unintelligible). Oh, and a driver! It has to hold a driver...for which we are always looking for new volunteers!

Anyway, we'd like to put our truck down...er, out to pasture and get a new one. Yes, frankly, there may be some selfish reasons for this, like the smell we can't seem to get rid of in the current truck and the disintegrating steering wheel (for which Charles found a work-around, thankfully). But, the practical items are the real driver, pardon the pun. We would like to have one where everything is working as it should, possesses some safety features that have become more common in recent years and finally, some additional storage capacity and capability. For one thing, we currently spend about 15 minutes to set up the sound system each day and another 15 to break it down (okay, so Charles can do it faster than I can, well... John can too...and so can Brandi, but anyway the point is we spend about 20-30 minutes setting the site up and breaking it down every day). Many of our volunteers are not comfortable with setting up our sound system. With a new vehicle, we hope to have the system more permanently set so that you just pretty much open the doors and start the music. We really think in this day and age introducing a display screen on-site would be good for displaying pictures, presentations

and videos relative to our story for the week. We think we can do that with the vehicles we are currently considering. Finalizing the decision is difficult and we appreciate your prayers and appreciate those of you who are contributors to this tremendous expense.



#### **VBS** – The Highlight of the Summer!



For a second year, we were able to take some of our kids to Vacation Bible School. First Baptist was once again gracious enough to provide busses and many of our missionaries volunteered to ride the busses and help get the kids to VBS. The numerous volunteers at FBC and their commitment to our kids and the children of the church and other invited guests is amazing and the job they do is truly impressive. I wish you could see and hear how excited the kids are. Many of them get off the bus on Friday talking and asking us about next week only for us to have to explain to them that it is over. Throughout the year, many of them will still excitedly talk about VBS and ask whether we will be doing it again this year.

We make an effort to reach out to the households of those children making decisions during the week hoping to have them back on Sunday night so they can be baptized with their family

present. This year, we had a brother and sister get baptized with their mother present. All in all, we saw 35 children from four sites attend and seven make decisions to trust Jesus Christ as their Savior.

Getting our kids to VBS may be one of the harder things we do because we do it on a shoestring budget of volunteers. So many of our SFS missionaries are involved in working at VBS, we can be shorthanded on volunteers. If we are able to attend VBS again this summer, we can use people to canvas the apartment complexes to let them know we will be picking their children up for the week and then to help ride the bus each morning and afternoon to get the kids to VBS and back home. For those of you who can envision the children asking to go again next week, please know we welcome the opportunity to partner with other churches who might want to invite some of the children to whom SFS ministers to their VBS and who can help in providing the resources necessary.
