In 1995, Burl and Betty Traylor took a group of young ministry students to share the Gospel on the street corners of New York for a week. They visited Metro Ministries, an inner city ministry to the kids of New York City. Betty felt the Holy Spirit wash over her, anointing her and telling her she would do this work in Jacksonville. Just one year earlier, they had followed God's call and began working with City Center, a local church reaching out to the unchurched of downtown. Now the Lord would use this journey to New York

to move them along in His journey with Burl and Betty.

No one was more selfless, more giving, or more Christ-like than Betty Traylor. She was a joy to be around, and an encouragement to others even when she faced discouraging times. She leaves a legacy and an example for us to follow.

After much struggling with the Lord, Betty and Burl committed to the vision they knew God was giving them - to reach kids in unchurched communities throughout Jacksonville. Sidewalk Funday School, as the name implies, would be an exciting, impassioned presentation of God's Holy Word set in a fun atmosphere of rollicking praise music, a loud sound system, crazy games...and a blue tarp.

All this was meant to involve Betty, Burl and those that would come alongside them, in the lives of these children every week. They would not simply tell of the love of Jesus Christ but they would show His love to them as well, and watch them come to know Christ as their Savior, learn songs about the Lord, and learn



His Word so that it might change their lives.

In 2003, Betty left her 35-year career as a Respiratory Therapist to "retire" into this ministry running six sites and working tirelessly six days a week. Later, Robbie would be added - of all the children Betty spiritually raised in this world, the only one who could truly call her "Mom".

Now, 2,500 Funday School services later, 19 Birthday Parties for Jesus, and untold numbers having heard the Gospel and turning to

Christ, Betty retired to her true rest. On March 6, 2015, the Founder of Sidewalk Funday School went Home to be with her Lord.

While we miss Betty terribly, our hearts are not troubled and the ministry God gave to Betty already carries on – at six sites, six days a week. Mrs. Betty knew her Savior, she knew her mission...

### **Happy Birthday Jesus Party**

The annual "Happy Birthday Jesus" Christmas party was celebrated on the first Saturday of December. FBC Jacksonville graciously opens their doors to allow us to use their facilities for this event. With great excitement, for the first time we were able to combine this with the Children's Department Christmas musical to provide a real treat for our kids – a Christian production of the caliber most of them would otherwise not get to see were it not for this annual event. God's great and perfect timing brought the play's Director, Teri Van Duyn and our President, Kimberly Hansen together (you should ask Kimberly to tell you the story when you see her) to arrange this combination. Both of these women have a tremendous heart to reach children for the Lord and to help "train them up in the way they should go". Through the generous donations of those who support this ministry, ten buses were rented to bring some 500 children and 25 parents from seven

sites. They soon were engaged in games and singing and then were presented the gospel through the program with a call to come to Christ by this ministry's great friend, Pastor Angel Santiago. Afterwards, while they were leaving, they were given perhaps the only Christmas present they will receive. The greatest gift, though, was Jesus Christ as some 65 decisions were made for Him. In addition to Mrs. Van Duyn, FBC, and Pastor Angel, we want to thank our other partner ministries without whom this experience could not have been accomplished.

#### **Community Empowerment**

Mayor Alvin Brown hosted the first Renew Jax Community Empowerment Day on Saturday, Feb. 7, 2015 at Eureka Gardens, with subsequent events held at Washington Heights and Cleveland Arms which were focused on bringing service providers from the community, directly to the neighborhoods of the residents that need them. But her first love is the Lord and her heart is to reach children with the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

Wayne Simmons, SFS board member and Treasurer, is the longest-serving volunteer at SFS and has worked closely with Betty and Burl for over ten years. In commenting on the board's decision, he said, "Even in Betty's absence, the ministry continues. Betty would have it no other way and, in fact, when diagnosed with cancer, immediately began taking steps to insure ministry continuity. She had great trust and faith in Kimberly and was convinced the Lord had brought her to volunteer at SFS at just the right time."

Jack Cummings, Chairman of the Board, stated "Deuteronomy 34:10 tells us, 'There arose not a prophet since in Israel like unto Moses, whom the lord knew face to face.' Yet when Moses died God had a leader prepared in Joshua. There will never be another Betty Traylor. She too was a great leader with a vision given by God. Just as God did with Joshua, in Kimberly Hansen He has prepared a leader to follow Betty. Just as Moses knew who would follow him and knew him personally and put his hand of approval upon Joshua, so has Betty done with Kimberly.
